

Our Mission

To empower individuals to make independent, informed decisions about their sexual and reproductive lives, we provide information and health care, and promote public policies that make those services available to all. *Planning is Power.*

Clinical Services

Our five health centers in Manhattan, Brooklyn, the Bronx, Queens, and Staten Island provide state-of-the-art reproductive health care. Whether the need is for contraception, pregnancy tests, abortion services, or tests for sexually transmitted infections, we're here for our patients – regardless of their age, gender, immigration status, or ability to pay. Medical interpretation and translated materials are available for non-English-speaking patients.

Our Services

We provide birth control; emergency contraception ("the morning-after pill"); wellness exams for all genders; gynecological care, including breast exams and cervical cancer screening (Pap test); colposcopy; pregnancy testing and options counseling (including adoption referrals); surgical abortion and medication abortion; testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections; the HPV vaccine; HIV testing and counseling; Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) to prevent HIV infection; and help in obtaining health insurance.


Project Street Beat

Project Street Beat is a long-trusted provider of health care services in the Bronx, Brooklyn, and northern Manhattan. Our staff work with New York City's most marginalized individuals who are at high risk for transmission of HIV and sexually transmitted infections (STI). In our mobile medical unit, minivans, and two offices, we offer HIV and STI testing, condoms, reproductive health care, opioid overdose prevention, syringe distribution and disposal, risk reduction counseling, case management, and other supportive services.



Our Patients in 2015

- More than **53,000** patients made 87,240 visits to our health centers.
- 61%** of our patients were insured by Medicaid, paid reduced rates, or received our services for free.
- 71%** of our patients were under the age of 30 and the vast majority were women.

Health Services Facts 2015

- Successfully helped **6,853** patients obtain health insurance
- 57,230** sexual and reproductive health visits and **6,642** pregnancy tests
- 94,510** tests for sexually transmitted infections
- 29,490** HIV tests
- 8,562** Pap tests to screen for cervical cancer
- 17,934** abortions – 90% in the first trimester; 35% were medication abortions

Education and Training

We offer a wide range of programs for youth, adults, and professionals.

Evidence-Based Programs

PPNYC facilitates three evidence-based interventions to reduce adolescent sexual risk behaviors in schools and community organizations in Brooklyn, Manhattan, the Bronx, and Queens. "Making Proud Choices" and "Be Proud! Be Responsible!" are STI, HIV, and pregnancy prevention programs for young people aged 11-19. "Be Proud! Be Responsible! Be Protective!" is an HIV prevention program designed for young mothers and pregnant girls.

Teen Advocates

Our highly trained peer educators conduct interactive workshops to educate young people about teens' rights and access to sexual and reproductive health care. Teen Advocate workshops are available in the South Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, and Queens.

Taking Care of You

The "Taking Care of You" workshops focus on healthy sexuality, prevention of unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections, and positive communication in relationships. The series is offered to schools and community organizations in the Bronx, Brooklyn, and Manhattan.

All of Us

PPNYC created this comprehensive sexuality education curriculum for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and questioning (LGBTQ) youth. The seven-session series is tailored to the needs of LGBTQ youth groups and is offered in the Bronx, Brooklyn, and Manhattan.

Male Inclusion Services

Through community outreach, forums, and one-on-one interactions, we aim to reach adolescent males in the Bronx, Brooklyn, and Manhattan with health education materials, safer sex kits, and information about accessing sexual and reproductive health services.

Adult Role Models

The Adult Role Models are local parents and caring adults trained to facilitate a four-part workshop series in schools and community organizations throughout the city to help other parents and caring adults talk with their kids about sexuality and strengthen parent-child relationships.

Promotores de Salud

The Promotores are bilingual peer health educators who seek to increase access to sexual and reproductive health care for Latinas in New York City through outreach, workshops, and linkage to care.

Sexuality Education for Adults

These workshops, which are specially designed for adult groups, aim to enhance sexual health and wellness by connecting participants to the information and care they need.

Training Institute

The Training Institute prepares professionals to serve as trusted educators and resources in their agencies and communities. Our trainings cover key sexual and reproductive health issues, best practices, and model education programs. We train hundreds of professionals who then reach thousands of community members.

Organizational Capacity Building

PPNYC helps youth- and adult-serving organizations to develop policies, staff knowledge, and resources related to sexual and reproductive health (SRH). We collaborate with administrators and staff to improve their ability to provide SRH education and referrals to their clients.
